Director's Final Findings and Orders Fee Exemption:

I. JURISDICTION

These Director's Final Findings and Orders ("Orders") are issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("Ohio EPA") under Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") Section 3734.57(D)(8).

II. DEFINITIONS

Unless otherwise stated, all terms used in these Orders shall have the same meaning as defined in ORC Chapter 3734 and the rules promulgated thereunder.

III. FINDINGS

The Director of Ohio EPA ("Director") has determined the following findings:

- 1. United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) has initiated a cleanup of an estimated 23,300 tons of lead-contaminated soil at the Friendship Pottery I Site in Roseville, Ohio, located at 90 Church Street, in Perry County (Site). The Site is comprised of residential properties, former pottery parcels, and a larger parcel, which are expected to yield approximately 5,000 tons, 5,300 tons, and as much as 13,000 tons of lead-contaminated soil, respectively.
- 2. Ohio EPA was approached by USEPA, Region 5, requesting an exemption from the waste fees levied under ORC Chapter 3734. A timely remediation project is necessary to address public health and environmental protection concerns from the contamination located on the Site.
- 3. The estimated commencement of the remediation project is the week of November 11, 2019. The remediation project will include the removal and proper disposal of lead-contaminated soil. The material is solid waste as defined in Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC") Rule 3745-27-01(S)(24).
- 4. This remediation project at the Site is anticipated to generate approximately 23,300 tons of solid waste.

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- 5. Pursuant to ORC Section 3734.57(A), state disposal fees are to be levied on the disposal of solid waste at solid waste facilities. These solid waste disposal fees are to be collected and remitted to the state of Ohio on each ton of solid waste disposed at solid waste disposal facilities.
- 6. The solid waste that will be generated and disposed as a result of this project is subject to a \$4.75 per ton state disposal fee pursuant to ORC Section 3734.57(A).
- 7. Pursuant to ORC Section 3734.57(D)(8), the Director may issue an order exempting from the fees levied under ORC Sections 3734.57 solid wastes that are generated, transferred, or disposed of as a result of a contract providing for the expenditure of public funds entered into by the administrator or regional administrator of the USEPA, the Director, or the director of administrative services on behalf of the Director for the purpose of remediating conditions at a hazardous waste facility, solid waste facility, or other location at which the administrator or regional administrator or the Director has reason to believe that there is a substantial threat to public health or safety or the environment or that the conditions are causing or contributing to air or water pollution or soil contamination.

IV. ORDERS

Pursuant to ORC Sections 3734.57(D)(8), the solid waste disposed as a result of USEPA's remediation of the Site is hereby exempted from the requirement to collect and remit fees levied pursuant to ORC Section 3734.57(A). This exemption shall not apply to any solid waste other than the solid waste described in Findings Numbers 1 and 4, above.

V. EFFECTIVE DATE

The effective date of the Orders is the date these Orders are entered into the Ohio EPA Director's Journal.
