Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g) Approval**

Dear Madam/Sirs:

On April 10, 2015, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Materials and Waste Management (DMWM), Northeast District Office (NEDO) received a document titled "OAC 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g) Request" included in the "Statistical

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*Analysis Program for Ground Water Quality Monitoring, Revision 6,* dated April 2015 for the Central Waste Landfill, LLC (Facility) located in Mahoning County. This document was prepared by Eagon & Associates, Inc. on behalf of the Facility.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g), background data can be added only in blocks of data resulting from the analysis of four or more statistically independent samples after the data have been statistically compared to the current background data and no statistical differences are detected, unless another method is deemed acceptable to the director.

Central Waste Landfill, LLC has proposed to update background datasets as part of the Facility's background data for the following well/parameter combinations:

- Six down-gradient Middle Mercer Uppermost Aquifer System (UAS) wells: MW-3D (barium), MW-15DR (barium and potassium), MW-17D (potassium), MW-5D (arsenic, potassium, zinc and sodium), MW-7D (ammonia and barium) and MW-8DR (chloride), and;
- Two down-gradient Mine Spoil UAS wells: MW-14S (cobalt, nickel, chloride, selenium and sodium) and MW-5SR (cobalt, nickel and zinc).

Ohio EPA has reviewed the applicable information and concurs with the addition of the above data to existing back ground data. Therefore, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g), the owner or operator is hereby authorized to incorporate the above data in the Facility's background data.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Environmental Protection (Director) is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio." The Commission, in its discretion, may reduce the fee if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
