Dear Graham:

On February 23, 2024, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) completed its annual survey of your health district regarding your Solid and Infectious Waste Programs and Construction and Demolition Debris Programs in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code Rule 3745-37-08. The annual survey included the time period between March 17, 2023, and February 23, 2024.

Upon review of the survey findings, I have determined that the Lake County General Health District is in substantial compliance and I hereby place the Lake County General Health District on my approved lists of health districts authorized to administer and enforce the solid and infectious waste and construction and demolition debris laws and rules in accordance with Sections 3734.08 and 3714.09 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC).

Additionally, you are hereby notified that this action of the director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to ORC Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio." The Commission, in its discretion, may reduce the fee if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental

Enforcement Section. An appeal may be filed with the Environmental Review Appeals Commission at the following address:

Comments

OAC Rule 3745-37-08(C)(8) and (D)(7):

During the administrative review of records, Ohio EPA determined that Lake County General Health District (LCGHD) properly cited violations for conditions observed during inspections conducted throughout the survey period. The health district promptly investigated and brought about resolution of solid waste or C&DD complaints within its jurisdiction.

Solid waste and C&DD complaints are resolved by conducting inspections and sending notice of violation letters or placing hangtags at the property identifying the violations. Re-inspections are conducted within weeks. If the violations are not resolved in a timely manner, then written board orders are sent or board hearings are scheduled. If board orders or board hearings do not resolve the violations, the complaint is forwarded to the Prosecutor's Office for resolution. During the annual survey period, LCGHD received 102 solid waste and C&DD complaints; all but two cases have been resolved. The health district is actively working to resolve the two remaining cases.

OAC Rule 3745-37-08(C)(9) and (D)(8):

No serious public health hazards resulting from violations of the solid and infectious waste rules or C&DD rules were on the record for this survey period.

Findings/Recommendations: Elizabeth Militante-Advey demonstrated knowledge of the solid waste regulations and accurately evaluated the landfill for compliance with all applicable laws, rules, and authorizing documents. The health district conducts monthly comprehensive inspections and, when needed, partial inspections to determine compliance with OAC Chapter 3745-27-19. During the inspection, Ms. Militante-Advey used the appropriate checklist and took notes to document observations. She observed the working face, the capped portions of the landfill, and the perimeter slopes. The inspection also included an administrative review of the facility records and verification of a valid facility license. Ms. Militante-Advey noted the following:

- Daily logs, odor complaint logs, and the operating record were complete.
- The current 2024 license was posted by the records room.
- A horizontal collector was installed on the western side of the landfill.
- Leachate sumps were in operation.
- No odors were detected along Bacon Road.
- Vegetative cover was observed on all capped portions of the landfill.
- No ponding was observed on the capped portions of the landfill.
- Some litter was present around the perimeter slopes; however, individuals were actively collecting trash at the time of the inspection.

No violations were noted.

Ms. Militante-Advey summarized her findings for Ohio EPA following the inspection. Ohio EPA concurred with her findings and made no additional recommendations. After receiving and reviewing a copy of the inspection letter dated March 6, 2024, Ohio EPA determined that the inspector accurately documented the February 16, 2024, inspection.

Findings/Recommendations: Elizabeth Militante-Advey demonstrated knowledge of the infectious waste regulations and accurately evaluated the autoclave for compliance with all applicable laws, rules, and authorizing documents. The health district conducts facility inspections quarterly to determine compliance with OAC Chapter 3745-27. The inspection included an administrative review of the facility records and observation of facility operations. The hospital will no longer treat infectious waste at the hospital and has contracted with Daniels Health, which is a medical waste disposal service. During the inspection, Ms. Militante-Advey used the appropriate checklist and took notes to document observations. Ms. Militante-

Advey observed the infectious waste treatment facility autoclave, the handling and storage area for infectious waste, and the infectious waste generator registration. Ms. Militante-Advey noted the following:

- The facility management plan was current and complete.
- The autoclave was not operational at the time of the inspection.
- All infectious waste is collected by Daniels twice a week.
- Tripoint has begun the process of decommissioning the autoclave.
- Disposal shipping papers for the waste were organized and complete.
- The infectious waste storage area was appropriately labeled and locked.
- The waste was stored in a non-putrescent manner and the waste containers were properly maintained.

No violations were noted.

Ms. Militante-Advey summarized her findings for Ohio EPA following the inspection. Ohio EPA concurred with her findings and made no additional recommendations. After receiving and reviewing a copy of the inspection letter dated March 6, 2024, Ohio EPA determined that the inspector accurately documented the February 13, 2024, inspection.

- Infectious waste was stored in a locked room.

- Infectious waste generated was adequately segregated at the point of generation and placed into appropriate sharps containers or a red bag-lined box.
- All infectious waste is collected by Daniels twice a week.

During the inspection, Ms. Militante-Advey observed the passive explosive gas vents, the integrity of the cap system, and whether any leachate outbreaks were present. compliance with OAC Chapter 3745-400. Ms. Militante-Advey used the appropriate checklist, asked for clarifications, and took notes to document observations. Ms. Militante-Advey noted the facility has a valid PTI and license and the facility is in compliance with these documents. Ms. Militante-Advey noted the following:

- No dust, odors, vectors, scattered litter, or other nuisances were observed.
- Records, including incoming and outgoing logs, were reviewed and found to be in order and complete.
- Road were maintained.
- Operations are being confined to the horizontal and vertical limits of their PTI (150 feet by 120 feet by 15 feet high).

No violations were observed.

Findings/Recommendations: Ms. Militante-Advey inspects this facility type on an as-needed or complaint basis to determine compliance with OAC Chapter 3745-580. The inspection included an administrative review of facility records and observation of facility operations. Ms. Militante-Advey noted the following:

- Scrap tires were stored in a locked and covered shed.
- Scrap tires were free of water.
- Scrap tires are picked up by a licensed scrap tire transporter.
- Shipping papers are maintained at the facility.

No violations were noted.

Ms. Militante-Advey utilized Ohio EPA's inspection checklist while conducting the inspection. She summarized her findings of the inspection to Ohio EPA following the inspection. At the time of the inspection, Ohio EPA acknowledged the inspector's findings and made no additional recommendations. After receiving and reviewing a copy of the inspection letter dated March 20, 2024, Ohio EPA determined the inspector adequately documented the inspection on February 13, 2024.

Solid and Infectious Waste Programs Summary

The health district conducts all required comprehensive inspections at licensed and registered facilities within its jurisdiction to ensure compliance with the solid and infectious waste regulations. The health district appropriately documents violations with a comprehensive notice of violation letter to the owner/operator detailing any violations, including rule citations and any additional information from the inspection. The

health district requests a response from the facility on actions taken to remedy or prevent the violation from reoccurring and conducts reinspections at facilities if violations are noted to ensure that compliance is achieved. The health district effectively manages solid waste complaints and has procedures in place to escalate enforcement if necessary.

Construction and Demolition Debris Programs Summary

The health district conducts all required comprehensive inspections at licensed facilities within its jurisdiction to ensure compliance with the construction and demolition regulations. The health district issued the permit-to-install and license to Jack Neff Sand and Gravel – C&DD Processing Facility on December 31, 2023.

Post-Survey Conference

On February 23, 2024, I held a post-survey conference at the Lake County General Health District with Chris Loxterman, Environmental Supervisor, and Elizabeth Militante-Advey, inspector, to summarize the annual survey findings. During the post-survey conference, we discussed the health district's compliance with ORC Sections 3734.08 and 3714.09. I informed Mr. Loxertman that, based on my observations during the survey, I would be recommending the health district remain on the director's approved lists.

This Annual Survey Evaluation Report is for internal use to perform a preliminary assessment of approved health districts. It is not to be used as an indication of a health district's overall compliance with OAC Rule 3745-37-08, which is a determination of the director of Ohio EPA. This Report and any accompanying information will be forwarded to the director for consideration and to determine substantial compliance with OAC Rule 3745-37-08.
