

Following EPA guidelines, Southern Perry Water currently monitors each system to ensure our lead and copper levels do not pose a health risk to our customers.



If you would like to participate in the lead/copper sampling program, please call the office at 740-347-9030 Monday through Friday 9:00 am to 2:00 pm and give the clerk the information for your residence. You may also write the info down and return it with your water payment. After reviewing the information you return to the office, the data will be analyzed to see if your residence qualifies for the sampling program. We appreciate your time and efforts in completing the necessary information.
