### VERIFICATION FORM FOR COMMUNITY PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS CLAIMING NO LEAD SERVICE LINES

The owner or operator of all community public water systems must identify and map areas of their distribution system that are known or are likely to contain lead service lines. Systems must submit a copy of the applicable map to the Ohio Department of Health and the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services. Systems must also submit a report to the director containing at least both of the following: (1) The applicable map with narrative, and (2) A list of sampling locations used to collect samples as required by Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 6109.121 and any rules adopted thereunder, including contact information for the owner and occupant of each sampling site.

Should a water system determine no lead service lines exist in their distribution system, they must provide information stating they reviewed, at the minimum, historical permit records and local ordinances, distribution maintenance records and information pertaining to installation dates or materials for all services lines. This information must be verified below.

# Lead Mapping and Sample Monitoring Points Project for the Jefferson County Water and Sewer District- Area O, PWS ID# OH4101203

Area O consists of approximately 145 water services and a population of 363. The source of water for this area is the Toronto Water Department, via the Wintersville water system.


Within Area O, all residential service lines in this area are *known to not be lead*, both on the utility side and the customer side. This is known due to the fact that all of the meters are located in meter wells in parcel rights-of-way (ROWs) and were installed by the District itself. Furthermore, all new service lines in any of our service areas are required to be PVC and this has been standard practice since the inception of the District.

Throughout Area O, the vast majority of buildings are approximately 40 years old and newer. Although it is one of the newest areas we serve, the likelihood of lead-containing solder in these buildings remains high. Buildings in Ohio built prior to 1998 or that use plumbing material or solder manufactured before 1998 may have materials with greater than 8% lead and are at a higher risk of contributing lead to the drinking water than materials manufactured after 1998. Buildings built and plumbing materials manufactured after 2014 were required to have less than 0.25% lead by weight and have the lowest risk for contributing lead to the drinking water. It should be noted however that, although prohibited, some use of leaded solder or leaded components may have occurred after the prohibitions became effective.

In December of 2016, we issued a press release to the local newspaper asking residents to contact us if they know or suspect they have a lead service line. There were no responses for this system but we will continue to perform public outreach.

The mapping portion of this communication is comprised of one map showing the entire county-wide District with all four of our public water systems and their transmission lines shown. A smaller sub-map of the subdivision generated from Google Earth is then provided, the legend of which indicates the known presence of *lead* in yellow, *no lead* in green and *unknown materials* in blue. The sub-map of this system's subdivision is coded green on both the public and private side of the service point, signifying the absence of any lead service lines in the entire system. A verification form is included in this transmission.
