Lead Service Line Mapping and Documentation

Dear Ms. Carper:

On behalf of the Village of West Lafayette, I am pleased to present mapping and documentation regarding lead service lines in response to the requirement of House Bill 512 for the Village of West Lafayette Public Water System, PWS ID: OH1600712.

The following documents are presented as defined in Ohio EPA Document PWS-04-001, Guidelines for Lead Mapping in Distribution Systems:

- Lead Service Line Map This represents best available data at this time.
 The lines installed in 1904 and 1923 may have lead service lines.
- Sample Monitoring Points List This represents the most recent drinking water lead and copper sampling and testing data at various locations throughout the Village.

The Village of West Lafayette does not currently have detailed records of the service line material or age within the system. The following data and assumptions were utilized in development of the map:

- Interviews were conducted with current and former employees.
- Water service line age is assumed based on any available water main installation year data, unless water mains were replaced.
- Any parcel along a Village water main is shown on the map.
- Buildings in West Lafayette built prior to 1998 or that use plumbing material or solder manufactured before 1998 may have materials with greater than 8% lead and are at a higher risk of contributing lead to the drinking water than materials manufactured after 1998. In addition, buildings built and plumbing materials manufactured after 2014 were required to

have less than 0.25% lead by weight and have the lowest risk of contributing lead to the drinking water.

It should be noted however that, although prohibited, some use of leaded solder or leading components may have occurred after the prohibitions became effective.

 In 2015, the Village installed 12 new fire hydrants through-out the Village. The installation of the hydrants required a hot-tap which resulted in a piece of pipe being removed at each location. At all locations, the pipe was either steel, ductile iron, or plastic. No lead piping was found.

The Village will inspect 50% of the service lines in 2017 to determine materials of construction and the remaining 50% in 2018.
