Buildings in Ohio built prior to 1998 or that use plumbing material or solder manufactured before 1998 may have materials with greater than 8% lead and are at a higher risk of contributing lead to the drinking water than materials manufactured after 1998. In addition, buildings built and plumbing materials manufactured after 2014 were required to have less than 0.25% lead by weight and have the lowest risk for contributing lead to the drinking water. It should be noted however that, although prohibited, some use of leaded solder or leaded components may have occurred after the prohibitions became effective.

Subject: Mapping of New Knoxville for Lead Identification PWS ID# OH-0601012

In compliance with HB 512, I am enclosing a map/aerial photograph which shows the Village of New Knoxville, OH and highlights the two specific subdivisions in which we would not expect to find lead soldered joints in the copper water lines inside the houses. These two subdivisions were developed after 1998 so our anticipation is that any solder used in these homes would comply with the lead limits set by EPA to reduce the risk of lead poisoning. You will note these two subdivisions are highlighted in red. The northern subdivision is Westphalia Subdivision and the western subdivision is named Westhaven Subdivision

Homes in the rest of the village would generally be expected to have copper water lines that have lead-soldered joints and could be at risk of having higher lead content in the water. We have no exact records of exactly what type of water lines are serving each individual home in the village. I have discussed this issue with a local plumbing contractor who has a working knowledge of many of the homes in our community. They indicated that most if not all of the homes in the village would be suspect for having soldered joint copper lines with lead limits that might exceed the Ohio E.P.A. limitation.

We are also enclosing a list of our sampling monitor points (SMP) within our village for your file.

We would like to confirm for your record that our water distribution system serving the community has no soldered joints in the mains or individual water service laterals. Our water mains are PVC (poly-vinyl chloride) plastic (SDR 18) and though our original water-service laterals are copper, they are all "compression fit" couplings and joints so no solder was used and thus no lead issues. Our water distribution system was designed and installed in the early 1990's.




