Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(D)(2) Approval**

Dear Mayor Gallagher:

On April 10, 2017, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Materials and Waste Management (DMWM), Northeast District Office (NEDO) received a request, dated April 6, 2017, titled "Revised Parameter List Request City of Brooklyn Sanitary Landfill Brooklyn, Ohio." The document was submitted in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(D)(2) by Civil & Environmental Consultants, on behalf of the City of Brooklyn (City), and requested to remove 1,2-Dibromo-3-chloropropane (DBCP) and 1,2-Dibromoethane (EDB) from the list of Appendix I ground water monitoring parameters to be analyzed in monitoring wells at City of Brooklyn Landfill (Facility) located at 9400 Memphis Avenue, Brooklyn, Ohio.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(2), the owner or operator of a sanitary landfill facility may propose in writing to delete any of the Appendix I parameters monitored to meet the requirements of paragraphs (D)(5) to (D)(7) of OAC Rule 3745-27-10. The Director of Environmental Protection may approve an alternative list of monitoring parameters if the removed parameters are not reasonably expected to be in or derived from the waste contained or deposited in the sanitary landfill facility. Upon approval, the owner or operator may use the alternative list.

I have reviewed the applicable information and approve the alternative list removing DBCP and EDB from further detection ground water monitoring at the Facility for all monitoring wells except W-9R and W-12. Monitoring wells W-9R and W-12 are currently being sampled under the detection monitoring program pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D). The City was granted a variance from completing the assessment phase under OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E) for those wells. Ultimately, the wells will be in corrective measures under OAC Rule 3745-27-10(F). The City shall continue monitoring all wells in the monitoring system for the remaining parameters listed in Appendix I in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10, unless otherwise authorized by Ohio EPA.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio." The Commission, in its discretion, may reduce the fee if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
