Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g) Approval**

Dear Mr. Kimble:

On February 5, 2021, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Materials and Waste Management (DMWM), Southeast District Office (SEDO) received the document titled *OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g) Request to Update the Background Data Set for Chloride at Monitoring Well UMW-2* (Request). The document was submitted in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g) by Civil & Environmental Consultants Inc., on behalf of Kimble Sanitary Landfill, and requests approval to update the background data set for chloride at monitoring well UMW-2. This request was made for the Kimble Sanitary Landfill (Facility) located at 3596 State Route 39NW in Dover, Tuscarawas County, Ohio.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g), background data can be added only in blocks of data resulting from the analysis of four or more statistically independent samples after the data have been statistically compared to the current background data and no statistical differences are detected, unless another method is deemed acceptable to the Director.

Ohio EPA has reviewed the Request and concurs that the statistically different data be added to the existing background datasets. Ohio EPA's review determined that the owner or operator has provided sufficient evidence to demonstrate that the statistically different data can be added to the existing background datasets and meets the requirements of OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g) in the document. Therefore, Ohio EPA approves the Request pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g) at Kimble Sanitary Landfill.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Environmental Protection (Director) is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio." The Commission, in its discretion, may reduce the fee if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the


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Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section. An appeal may be filed with the Environmental Review Appeals Commission at the following address:
