Subject: Second Temporary Authorization for the New Stabilization Building

Dear Mr. McGillis:

On January 27, 2023, Ohio EPA received Reworld Bedford, LLC's (Reworld) request for a Class 3 permit modification. The modification request included a proposal for a new stabilization building along with other technical and operational changes at the facility. This Class 3 permit modification is currently under review by Ohio EPA.

On February 15, 2024, an initial temporary authorization request was received, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-50-51(F). On November 27, 2024, Ohio EPA approved the first temporary authorization for construction only of the new stabilization building and collection system.

On April 17, 2025, Ohio EPA received a second request for a temporary authorization to continue construction of the new stabilization building and collection system.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-50-51(F), the Director of Ohio EPA may, without prior public notice and comment, grant a permittee a temporary authorization to conduct activities which would otherwise require a Class 2 or Class 3 permit modification. The temporary authorization request must include a description of why the temporary authorization is needed and must provide sufficient information to ensure compliance with the applicable requirements of OAC Chapters 3745-54 to 3745-57, 3745-205, and 3745-266. A temporary authorization may be granted for a term not to exceed one hundred and eighty (180) days. In accordance with OAC Rule 3745-50-51(F)(4), a temporary authorization may be reissued for an additional term of up to one hundred and eighty (180) days.

In accordance with OAC Rule 3745-50-51(F), it has been determined that Reworld's temporary authorization request includes a description of the activities to be conducted under the temporary authorization, an explanation of why the temporary authorization is necessary, and sufficient information to ensure compliance with the standards of OAC Chapters 3745-54 to 3745-57, 3745-205, and 3745-266. Furthermore, it has been determined that the temporary authorization is necessary to facilitate changes to protect human health and the environment.

Reworld provided notice of the temporary authorization request as required by OAC Rule 3745-50-51(F)(2)(c).

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-50-51(F), Ohio EPA is approving a portion of the temporary authorization request that allows Reworld to proceed with the construction only of the designed stabilization building and collection system. Additionally, Reworld was required to address Ohio EPA's comments that were included in the first temporary authorization. On January 24, 2025, Reworld submitted a response to those comments included in the first temporary authorization.

The activities authorized herein must be conducted as described in the temporary authorization request and in compliance with ORC Chapter 3734 and the rules promulgated thereunder. This temporary authorization is effective upon journalization and expires one hundred and eighty (180) days thereafter, or on the date that the Class 3 modification request is approved or disapproved, whichever occurs first.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Section 3745.04 of the Ohio Revised Code. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship.

Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
